- 4. Chair Updates** (Thomas)
 - Meeting began with presentation from Michelle Miller.

- 5. Presentation** (Miller)
 - Michelle presented about the Larimer County Workforce Centers. The program is being updated, with programs dependent on available grant funds. The centers serve the general public, veterans, young adults, and the unemployed. There are three locations in Larimer County: Fort Collins, Loveland, and Estes Park. Miller stated two major barriers for employment include transportation and childcare. Programs offered include job fairs, screening and testing, job postings, and employment roundtables.

- 6. Discussion Items**
 - Larimer County Senior Transportation Study (Mason) – Larimer County is undertaking a Senior Transportation Study for the rural portions of the county. The County is applying for a Transit Planning 4 All Grant, which would allow the County to use existing funds for implementation. The Senior Transportation Coalition will act as the steering committee for the study.
 - Travel Training (Gordon) – Alex asked the group if they would be interested in participating in a Travel Training. Alex will reach out to Andrea from Transfort to set one up if there is interest.

- 7. MC Program Updates**
 - The NFRMPO will be updating the Human Services/Public Transit Coordinated Plan starting in October. The Plan will be completed by December 2017. This may mean combined WCMC and LCMC meetings to help guide the completion of

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the plan. The Plan will be translated into Spanish, and other languages as needed.

8. Council Member Reports

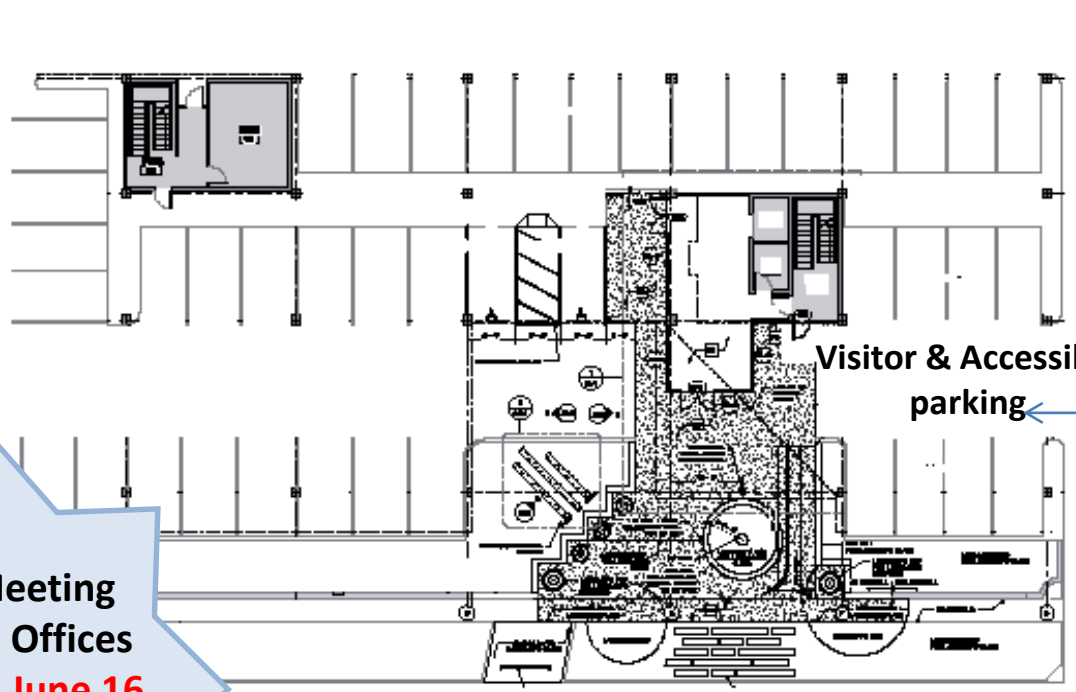
- **Mumma** – CO Department of Labor is working with the Larimer County Workforce Centers.

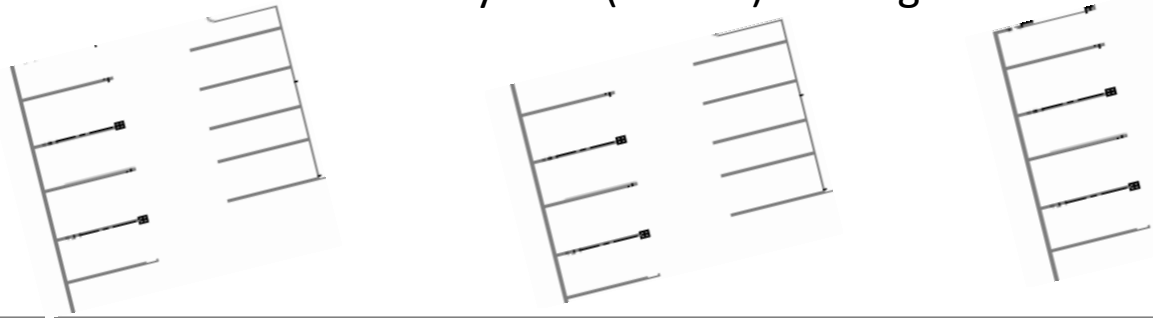

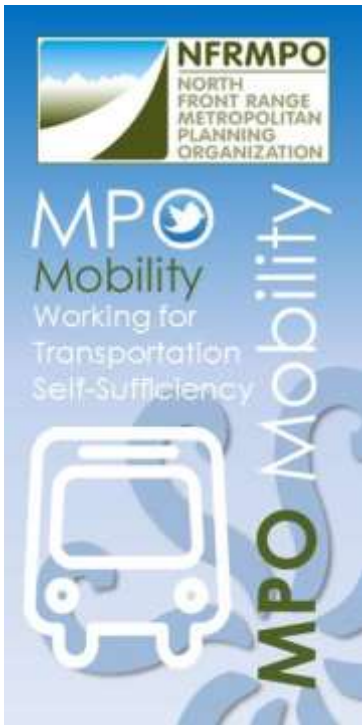


Visitor & Accessible

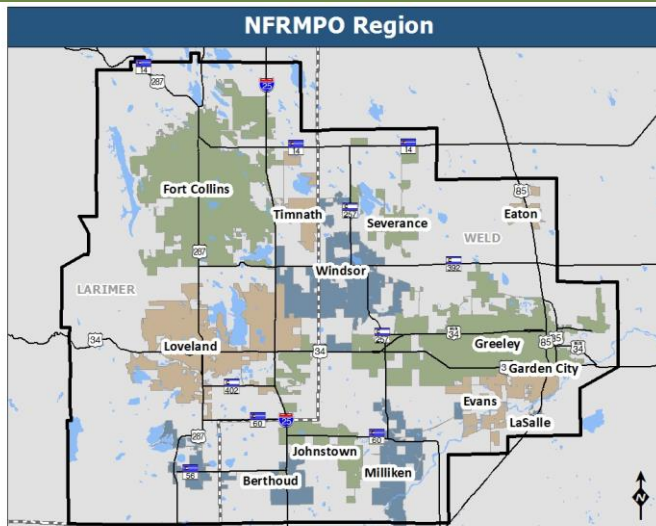

North Front Range MPO – Area Map



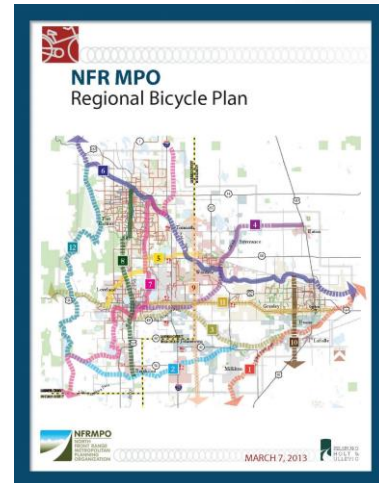

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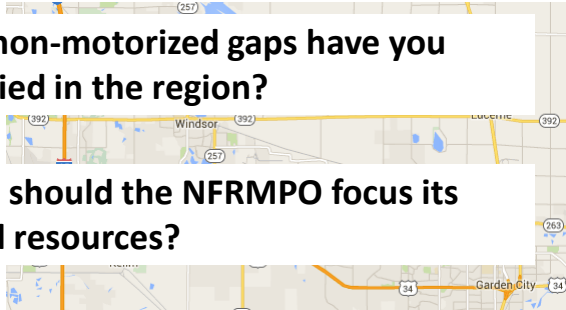
