Discussion Items

ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN	<p>Ryan Dusil from the NFRMPO presented on the Active Transportation Plan (ATP). The focus of the ATP is human-powered transportation, like bicycles, walking, using a wheelchair, etc. Ryan is currently in the stakeholder engagement phase. There are programmatic and infrastructural needs that will be addressed in the ATP. Ryan recapped some of the feedback from previous meetings, including popup events. Feedback from this meeting included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Anna stated Zagster is removing stations as they are shutting down in Fort Collins.• Katy said the CASOA could help identify some concerns for older adults related to transportation and mobility.• Alex stated some of the concerns could help inform future MAPG projects.• Cari said the Arc has a People First group, which can fill out and provide feedback on surveys.• Alex will send out the Community Remarks and presentation to MAPG members.• Ruth liked the mile markers on the Big Thompson Trail, which Ryan noted could be useful for emergency response and Cari noted could help with physical therapy. Ruth also liked the center lines, which can help maintain space and help with maintaining the lane.• The group discussed some concerns and benefits of e-bikes, including speed, distance, and safety.• Identify sidewalk gaps and other accessibility issues.• Ryan said this plan may be able to provide minimum trail standards for the region, including trail width, signage, what vehicles are allowed, and the need for lower speeds in certain areas.• Ruth recommended using the Berthoud Community Page to get

STATEWIDE TRANSIT PLAN	Alex summarized some of the Statewide Transportation Plan. CDOT is accepting comments through July 30, 2020. Ruth asked where the survey data is from. Alex responded CDOT sent out surveys to households with older adults and individuals with disabilities throughout Colorado. Katy recommended the VISTA compare the surveys to see how things have changed.

Member Updates

CARI	Arc of Larimer County has a COVID-related survey, which Alex will send out to the group.
ANNA	Transfort is still fare-free and will continue to be as driver barriers are installed on the buses. Transfort is looking for feedback on what will get riders to use the service again.
RUTH	Older adults have been slower to return to RAFT, but individuals with disabilities have been returning to work. Ridership is still down but has been increasing.
KATY	The Office on Aging has hired Katie Stieber as the new Program Manager. She starts on Monday.
MEGAN	zTrip is continuing to provide the on-demand service for Transfort. Due to a lack of awareness, ridership has been low. Riders can call day-of to be picked up at a bus stop. Anna will promote the service in the Transfort newsletter.
